July Priorities

Speeding has been raised as an issue in a number of our villages and is a particular problem in Mountsorrel. On Sunday 24 June the beat team on duty, assisted by Insp Botte, undertook speed enforcement in Swithland, Rothley and Mountsorrel. Over forty vehicles were stopped and eleven speeding tickets issued (six by the Inspector!) Additionally, one car was seized for having no insurance and one driver was dealt with for drugs possession. Further speed enforcement is planned for future months, so we aim to visit other villages where speeding is causing concerns.

We have received reports of antisocial behaviour involving cars around an address in Mountsorrel. So far, one car has been seized and the police are working with the Charnwood Borough Council ASB Team to resolve the issues for the neighbours.

Neighbourhood Watch

We are keen to reinvigorate our local Neighbourhood Watch Schemes and Sgt Chris Wharton is working on a project to review our current position and to identifying key local contacts who he will liaise with to bring the scheme back to the fore and make it fit for purpose of supporting our local communities.

Vehicle Crime

Leicestershire Police takes vehicle crime very seriously and understand the effects of such crime can be distressing and cause a lot of inconvenience for the owner. The more security you are able put in and around your vehicle, the less attractive it will be to thieves. Always look for products recommended by Thatcham or Sold Secure, as these meet certain attack test standards. Consider adopting some of the following security measures in order to try to reduce your likelihood of becoming a victim of future crime.

Deterring burglars can be done in a number of ways. Measures to consider are house alarms, window alarms, motion sensor security lights, and CCTV. Similarly for outbuildings and sheds, small alarms can be fitted. A lot of these alarms activate when a vibration is caused and any attempt to force a door or window would set them off. Please double check doors are locked and keys are accounted for. The police often find that vehicles are broken into when items are left on display. Even if the vehicle is locked this does not stop opportunist thieves from trying to get into the vehicle if items are left visible. No items of value should be left on display in your vehicles. These opportunist criminals are active throughout Charnwood and have been seen on CCTV to peer into vehicles looking for items and also to try a large number of vehicles doors on the off chance one is left open accidentally.



Crime Update

Over the last month we have had four burglaries reported to us. All of these occurred overnight. On three of the occasions no entry was gained to any properties and nothing was taken.

There have been three reports of vehicle crime in Mountsorrel over the month of July. These again occurred overnight where entry was gained to vehicles.
