We've had several great court outcomes as a result of fantastic work from local officers.


Our retailers will be particularly pleased with some of the sentences distributed, see overleaf for more details.

Patrol plans

Due to an increase in reports, officers will now prioritise and pay extra close attention to the following areas:

Beehive car park - Rough sleeping, beggars, drugs and Anti Social Behaviour (ASB)

McDonalds Market Place - currently closed for five weeks due to refurbishment, scheduled to re-open in early September.

Town Hall / Cattle Market - Rough sleepers, beggars, ASB and street drinking.

Victoria Street flats/ Radmoor park / Goodyard Close / Brown Lane Underpass - Drug dealing.



Good news for Loughborough Town Centre

PC Gary Bailey has worked very hard to secure fantastic results relating to three males causing problems in Loughborough Town Centre.

Cohen Barley, 17, of Station Boulevard, Loughborough, was sentenced to two years in prison and a criminal behaviour order was granted that will ban him from the Town Centre for 5 years upon his release.

Terry Spencer, 53, of no fixed address, was sentenced 30 months imprisonment for continual breaches of his civil injunction, which he continually breached. He was arrested on 30 June in Loughborough town centre.

Daniel Jones, 32, of no fixed address, Sentenced passed was 22 months imprisonment and the Criminal Behaviour Order extended for another five years. He has not to enter any of the retail premises which previously barred from and leave any premises that he has been asked to leave by staff.
